ADDITIONAL LOWER DIVISION MAJOR PREPARATION FOR SPECIFIC TRANSFER INSTITUTIONS

California State University – Dominguez Hills

SPAN 111 is also accepted as an alternative to SPAN 101. In addition to the Common Lower Division preparation courses for the California State University, there is one other lower division required course that must be taken at CSUDH.

California State University – Fullerton

The Common Lower Division major preparation for the California State University is required. Both SPAN 101 and SPAN 102 must be completed to articulate. Similarly, both SPAN 201 and SPAN 202 must be completed to articulate.

SPAN 111 is also accepted in place of the Common Lower Division preparation course of SPAN 101 and SPAN 112 is also accepted in place of the Common Lower Division preparation course of SPAN 102. Both SPAN 111 and SPAN 112 must be completed to articulate. In addition, the following courses are required:

California State University – Long Beach

One year of Intermediate Spanish at the college level or equivalent is required. Students who have completed sufficient high school Spanish or equivalent may take upper division courses as soon as proficiency requirements have been met. In addition to the Common Lower Division major preparation previously listed (SPAN 101, SPAN 102, SPAN 201, & SPAN 202); two years of a second foreign language at the college level, or equivalent is also required.

California State University – Los Angeles

No additional requirements other than the Common Lower Division preparation previously listed for the California State University (the four courses listed at the top). Students must have completed the second year of college-level Spanish prior to beginning the B.A. program.

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Transfer Preparation

As an alternative to completing the Common Lower Division preparation courses listed above, students can demonstrate equivalent language competency on the department's placement exam.

ADDITIONAL LOWER DIVISION MAJOR PREPARATION FOR SPECIFIC TRANSFER INSTITUTIONS

University of California – Irvine

This major does not require the completion of prerequisites for admission as a transfer student.

Students majoring in Spanish must choose one of the three following emphases: Literature and Culture; Spanish for Future Teachers; Cinema: Spain, Latin America, and U.S. Latino.

Students are recommended to complete the Common Lower Division major preparation (above) for the University of California prior to admission. In addition, they are required to complete at least one course from each of four areas (Writing, Literature, History, and Philosophy) for a total of four semester courses. A complete list of course options is available from ASSIST.org. Please consult a counselor, if necessary, to obtain this list.

University of California – Los Angeles

UCLA offers Spanish as a major although no formal articulation exists. Students are recommended to complete the Common Lower Division major preparation for the University of California prior to admission.

In addition, one Spanish civilization course, and one Spanish American civilization course as well as one Spanish composition course are required prior to admission. Cerritos College does not offer equivalents for these requirements so they will have to be taken at UCLA.

University of California – Riverside

No additional requirements other than the Common Lower Division major preparation for University of California previously listed. Intermediate level proficiency in Spanish is required.

Completion of the above course work is not mandatory for admission into this major. However, students are advised to complete as much lower division course preparation as possible prior to transfer, to be ready for upper division course work. Students choose from one of the following 3 options: Cultural Studies, Linguistics, or Literature. All course requirements under these options are upper division.

IMPORTANT NOTICE: The requirements listed for major are subject to change without notice. It is the student's responsibility to check for the most recent information with a Cerritos College counselor or by consulting ASSIST at www.assist.org.

NOTE: Courses listed may require prerequisite coursework.

How to use **ASSIST** to find your major preparation for CSU/UC:

1. **Log on:** www.assist.org
2. **Select an Institution:** select "Cerritos College" or other community college from pull-down menu
3. **Select:** "Type of Transfer Institution" such as "UC Los Angeles"
4. **Select a major from pull-down menu**
Report will show the university courses on the left and comparable community college classes on the right.
5. **PRINT:**-print by clicking on gold "**PRINT THIS REPORT**" button on top. Then use the **ASSIST** screen menu on the top toolbar or click on the printer icon that will appear at the bottom of the page.

How to use **ASSIST** to explore the majors available at University of California and California State University campuses

- Click on "EXPLORE MAJORS"

How to use **ASSIST** to figure out whether courses from the community college are transferable to the CSU/UC.

- Select the community college of interest (Cerritos College)
- Select either CSU transferable courses or UC Transferable courses
- Select a department for the courses in question
