DOSTOYEVSKY – NOTES FROM UNDERGROUND

NOTE: This book is sometimes called *Notes From the Underground* and the original Russian title was *Zapiski iz podpol'ya*. Some reference works will require you to look under these titles for information.

Also, the author's name is sometimes spelled Fedor Dostoevsky.

Your search for information on *Dostoyevsky* and *Notes From the Underground* can include books, periodical articles, online databases, and authoritative Internet resources.

Use the Cerritos College [Library Catalog](#) to find books on Dostoyevsky and his work. You can search by author, title, subject, or keyword. Find biographical material by searching under Subject, and type the last name first.

Online Journal and Reference Articles

Journals and magazines usually provide the most current information on a topic. Journal articles are more scholarly or professional while magazine articles tend to be shorter and more general. Newspaper articles, while not usually scholarly or professional, can give you the most current news and some additional facts on your topic. To find articles on your topic, use one of the online indexes listed below. They are available at [Database Page](#). Use subject headings similar to those used to locate books. The Library also has print indexes that must be used to find older articles, generally anything published before 1985.
