To find books written **about** Thomas Wolfe, search by **Subject**. To find books written **by** Thomas Wolfe, search by **Author**. Always type the last name first, e.g. **Wolfe, Thomas**.

Journal Articles

Journal and magazines usually provide the most current information on a topic. Journal articles are more scholarly or professional while magazine articles tend to be shorter and more general. Newspaper articles, while not usually scholarly or professional, can give you the most current news and some additional facts on your topic.

To find articles on your topic, use one of the online databases listed below. These databases usually provide full-text articles on almost every topic. They are available via the **Library Home Page**. Conduct your search by using subject headings and keywords similar to those you used to locate books such as the keyword associated with your topic, the designer's name, or the name of the type.

For remote access to the library databases, login via **MyLibrary**.

For historical research, the Library also has print indexes that must be used to find older articles, generally anything published before 1985.

Internet Sites

It is important that you evaluate the information you get from the Internet to determine if it is reliable and useful to your research. A few Internet sites that may be useful are listed here.
